Annex 1 - Mandatory Conditions under the Licensing Act 2003

Mandatory Licensing Conditions - Pubs, Clubs & Restaurants

SUPPLY OF ALCOHOL

No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence:-

1. at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
2. at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence has been suspended.
3. Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

REGISTERED DOOR STAFF

Each individual carrying out a 'security activity' must be licensed by the Security Industry Authority other than

1. in respect of premises within paragraph 8(3)(a) of Schedule 2 to the Private Security Industry Act 2001 (c.12) (premises with premises licences authorising plays or films), or
2. in respect of premises in relation to any occasion mentioned in paragraph 8(3)(b) or (c) of that Schedule (premises being used exclusively by club with club premises certificate, under a temporary event notice authorising plays or films or under a gaming licence), or
3. any occasion within paragraph 8(3)(d) of that Schedule (occasions prescribed by regulations under that Act).

For the purposes of this section

- "security activity" means an activity to which paragraph 2(1)(a) of that Schedule applies, and
- paragraph 8(5) of that Schedule (interpretation of references to an occasion) applies as it applies in relation to paragraph 8 of that Schedule.

MINIMUM PERMITTED PRICE FOR THE SALE OR SUPPLY OF ALCOHOL

1. A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.

2. For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 1—

(a) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979(a);

(b) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula—

$$P = D + (D \times V)$$

where—

(i) P is the permitted price,

(ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and

(iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;

(c) “relevant person” means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence—

(i) the holder of the premises licence,

(ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or

(iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;

(d) “relevant person” means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and

(e) “value added tax” means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994(b).

3. Where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.

4. (1) Sub-paragraph (2) applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 on a day (“the first day”) would be different from the permitted price on the next day (“the second day”) as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.

(2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

IRRESPONSIBLE PROMOTIONS

(1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.

(2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises—

(a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to—

(i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or

(ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);

- (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
- (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
- (d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner;
- (e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of disability).

POTABLE WATER

The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.

AGE VERIFICATION

- (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
- (2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
- (3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either—
 - (a) a holographic mark, or
 - (b) an ultraviolet feature.

MINIMUM MEASURES

The responsible person must ensure that—

- (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or

supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures—

- (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
- (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
- (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml;

(b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and

(c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.

Annex 2 – Conditions consistent with the operating schedule

General

-A capacity limit of 260 will be applied on the premises for performances of regulated entertainment except in as much as a seating capacity will be reduced to 180.

The Prevention of Crime and Disorder

- When alcohol is not being sold or supplied all stock should either be removed from the premises or if stored on the premises is to be kept in a secure and alarmed room.
- There will be a regular collection of bottles and glasses from public areas.
- All-inclusive nights or other irresponsible drinks promotions will not be permitted.

Public Safety

- The premises will hold an electrical safety report detailing that the electrical system at my premises meets the requirements of BS7671: 2001 IEE Wiring Regulations 16th Edition. The report for the electrical system in the premises will be valid for a five year period and on the expiry of that period a new Report will be issued.
- The Gas System including appliances will be inspected and tested by a CORGI registered gas engineer annually and a satisfactory Gas Safety Certificate will be obtained.
- All safety certificates and inspection reports will be kept on site and made available for inspection by officers of relevant statutory bodies.
- A supply of first aid equipment and materials will be available for the use of patrons based on a risk assessment carried out by the Licensee.

The Prevention of Public Nuisance

- Noise or vibration from the premises should not be excessive so as to give rise to reasonable complaint.
- Patrons will be reminded not to stand around talking in the street outside the premises or any car park, and where necessary on leaving be asked to leave the vicinity quickly and quietly. Notices to that effect will be prominently displayed on the premises.
- Hirer to ensure minimum noise on arrival and departure.
- No parking permitted within the grounds of the premises.
- Loading and unloading to be kept to a minimum.

The Protection of Children from Harm

- A proof of age policy will be in place.
- The Chagford Jubilee Hall Protection of Children from Harm Policy will be adhered to.
